# 2 pickups collide in Underwood

A driver and two passengers were injured in a two-vehicle crash Friday evening in Underwood, according to a news release from the Otter Tail County Sheriff's Office.

An 83-year-old Underwood man was driving a pickup truck south on Main Street North at 6:10 p.m. and he tried to make a left turn onto East Street North but cut in front of another pickup headed north on Main Street. The second truck, driven by a 25-year-old Dalton man, was unable to avoid the other vehicle and hit it on the front passenger side.

The 83-year-old sustained moderate injuries. Ringdahl Ambulance took him to Lake Region Hospital. He was wearing a seat belt.

Two passengers in the second truck, a 24-year-old and 3-year-old each from Fergus Falls, sustained possible injuries and were not transported by ambulance. The driver was not injured.

No citations were issued. Both vehicles were towed.

## 16-year-old driver injured in Richville crash

A 16-year-old New York Mills driver sustained a minor foot injury after a single-vehicle crash Friday night,

according to a news release from the Otter Tail County Sheriff's Office.

Just before 11:30 p.m., the driver traveled southbound on Jeff Lake Road near 355th Street when the teen lost control going around a curve, causing the vehicle to slide into a ditch and down an embankment. The vehicle hit a ditch with flowing water at the bottom, which caused it to roll onto its roof.

Nearby friends assisted in getting the driver out of the vehicle. The driver was not taken to a hospital. The vehicle sustained more than \$1,000 worth of damage.

Ottertail Fire and Rescue and Perham EMS assisted at the scene.

signed a three-year deal with the Wild last year. He has played more than 1,000 games in the NHL, and had 10 goals and 18 assists during the 2013-14 regular season with the Wild.

He was happy to get out and visit the smaller towns as part of the tour. The fan reception for him started out rough last year, since he played for so long with the rival Vancouver Canucks, but Minnesota fans soon showed their support for him.

"It didn't take long," Cooke said. "They accepted me as one of their own."

Derek Nelson, of Alexandria, had Cooke sign a Wild jersey for him. He talked to Cooke about wearing the No. 24, which was also worn by the late Derek Boogaard, who died in

2011.

"A lot of people felt the organization should have done something more like retire the number," Nelson said. "But at least somebody that plays hard is wearing it. I thought he's played very well."

Next in the autograph line was Aaron Nelson, of Alexandria, who wore a green Wild sweater, personalized with Boogaard's name and the No. 24. He didn't have Cooke sign the jersey, but he's a fan of his play and of the team in general.

"We try to make it to at least one (game) a year," Aaron said, adding that they watch the games "religiously" on television.

Sibling hockey players Falon, 12, and Michael, 9, Phelps, of Wahpeton, brought their hockey sticks for some autographs. The afternoon outing was

well worth it, judging by the smiles on their faces.

"It was awesome," Falon and Michael said in unison.

Greenlay has been a TV analyst for the Wild since 2002 and has done too many Road Tours to keep an exact count.

"It's been a lot of fun," he said. "You're going to see a lot of the same people."

Walz, who played more than 600 NHL games and was on the Wild's inaugural roster in 2000, is a veteran of the Road Tours. He knows how important they are for folks who are just as big of fans as those who pack the Xcel Energy Center for games.

"A lot of these folks, it's hard to get to the Twin Cities," Walz said. "It's nice that we're able to do this road tour."

# Rescue: 'Everything seemed like slow motion'

After opening the door, Hovland saw Ulschmid in the backseat, grabbed his arm and pulled him out of the car. Minutes later, an ambulance arrived, followed by the police.

The entire ordeal lasted two or three minutes, but it felt like a lifetime to Hovland.

"Everything seemed like slow motion," he said. "It was nerve-wracking, but I stayed calm."

Ulschmid sat on the ground holding his shoulder, according to Hovland. The 23-year-old was worried his boss at Carr's Tree Service

would be upset that he was late, but Hovland promised to talk to the man, who turned out to be Hovland's neighbor.

Attempts by The Daily Journal to reach Ulschmid were unsuccessful.

Hovland did not have to think about what he would do or how he could help: it was all instinct. In fact, he raced out of his car so quickly he left it running the whole time.

Hovland said by the looks of the accident, Ulschmid was lucky to have escaped major injury.

He drove back to his Ottertail home to change into dry clothes before heading into Fergus Falls for work.

Talking about the incident a day later, Hovland was still in shock, but he was glad to have helped. He feels it was not anything out of the ordinary, however.

His wife Kristy Rastadt-Hovland disagrees. Her husband was remarkably calm when he called her about 20 minutes after pulling Ulschmid out of the water and has tried to downplay his role since the accident.

But to Rastadt-Hovland, her husband is a hero.

"He was just so humble and he's that type of guy," she said. "It was just something that was part of his day."
