“Happy Ramblers,” according to Nycklemoe. That original sheet music will be performed by the Lakes Area All-Stars this weekend during a family-friendly street dance from 4-7 p.m. for the Imagine Fergus Falls Kickoff at the RTC grounds.

Fick put out a call for people to donate used instruments to his new music group.

The band director, who also played the saxophone and banjo with the group, used grocery-store-donated apple and banana crates to make band stands. They were “rather ruff,” Nycklemoe said, “but that’s OK. Nobody cared.”

The band formed in 1932 and consisted of seven to nine people playing whatever instruments were donated to them, including violins, saxophones, drums and the piano.

She helped her dad keep

the sheet music organized.

“I’d file them alphabetically so that we could get them out quickly,” Nycklemoe said.

The “Happy Ramblers” played in the RTC gym/auditorium every week from about 6:30-9 p.m. They moved the festivities out to the tennis courts during the warmer summer months.

They’d often attract a crowd, averaging around 75, according to Nycklemoe, and more for the outdoor concerts.

“Those that could dance would dance,” Nycklemoe said. “Those that didn’t would hold hands and walk around the edge.”

She also danced with some of the patients who didn’t get asked to dance

by others. Sometimes, she offered her talents on the snare drum. She remembers popular songs like “You Are My Sunshine,” “Alexander’s Ragtime Band” and “Mockingbird.”

For many years, Fick volunteered his time as band director. He later received \$10 per month for his efforts.

“The reason why my dad enjoyed it so much was it was his hobby,” Nycklemoe said. “To see them (the patients) enjoying it, that was enough for him, really.”

just north of Main Street between 1st Ave. N and the post office.

Business and property owners in the area are being asked to refrain from parking in the lot during construction. Owners can also coordinate deliveries with the construction contractor so access may be scheduled.

Per the city’s contract with the contractor, R.L. Larson Excavating of St. Cloud, Minn., the work must be completed by the end of October.

The project was slated for construction this year as part of Perham’s 2010-2011 Capital Improvement Plan.

### Test score improvement talk at school board

After statewide standardize test scores showed Pelican Rapids lower than

state average in reading and math, student performance dominated a special work session on Sept. 16 for the Pelican Rapids School Board, according to the Pelican Rapids Press.

Administrators were hesitant to take a defensive position about Pelican’s score and Superintendent Deb Wanek noted that school districts in the state nosedived on reading scores, which were more rigorous and challenging following statewide changes to the tests.

Pelican’s reading scores are comparable to other school districts with similar immigrant populations.

The student population is nearly 40 percent minority.

Intervention with lower performing students and more emphasis on learning during “Power Hour” study hall sessions are among the plans.

Reading coaches and intervention staff will con-

centrate on raising scores at the elementary level.

### Opening month enrollment up at Henning School

Enrollment for 2013-14 has increased at Henning School, according to the Citizen’s Advocate.

Enrollment stands at 382 students, according to a report giving to the school board.

After deducting students for post secondary options, the enrollment at the school is 377.75 students.

Those numbers are up from the end of the 2012-13 school year in which enrollment was 378 students before post secondary deductions and 376 after.

The 10th grade class is the largest with 38 students. The smallest is second grade with 16 students.
